

Memorandum of Understanding between

Griffith University, Australia and Hasanuddin University, Republic of Indonesia


Further to the Memorandum of Understanding signed on the 14 May 2007, **Griffith University**, Queensland, Australia and **Hasanuddin University**, Sulawesi Selatan, Republic of Indonesia, (individually a party and collectively parties to this Memorandum) wish to renew and expand this agreement and believe that:

1. Mutual benefit can be derived from scholarly interaction, cultural interchange, co-operative research and other forms of academic collaboration.
2. The parties regard the following areas of co-operation as desirable and feasible:
 - (i) Exchange of visiting scholars and academic staff members subject to mutual arrangements and agreement between the relevant faculties;
 - (ii) Co-operation, collaborative research and the delivery of award and non-award courses particularly in the areas of *Public Health* - community health planning, and environmental health, epidemiology and *Environmental Management, Environmental Protection and Quarantine* - climate change, and sustainable environmental policy and practice, pollution management, quarantine diseases, and *Business* - accounting, economics and finance;
 - (iii) Opportunities for other forms of co-operation, collaborative research and possible exchange of academic papers in the areas of medical research, nutrition, engineering, law and other specified areas;
 - (iv) Mutual assistance in the preparation of seminars, conferences and workshops;
 - (v) Exchange of academic publication materials or other information;
 - (vi) Co-operation in training projects for specified areas of development.
3. The terms of specific areas of co-operation shall be further considered and agreed upon in writing by the parties prior to the initiation of any particular activity.
4. Any specific program will be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds and approval of both parties.
5. The parties agree that this Memorandum of Understanding is not a formal legal agreement giving rise to any legal relationship, rights, duties or consequences, but it is only a definite expression and record of the purpose of the parties to which the parties are bound in honour only.

6. This Memorandum of Understanding shall remain in effect for a period of five years from the date of signing and it may be renewed for a further 5 years by the mutual agreement of both parties. The Memorandum can be terminated at any time by either party upon provision of six months' written notice. This Memorandum may be amended or modified at any time by the mutual consent of the cooperating institutions.




